Code Red With this intense summer heat, we need to be good stewards and try to help those less fortunate. Thank you to all who helped with this project. As of this writing we have collected over 75 cases of water and plan to have more before we are done. We also have received monetary contributions, so we were able to send Phoenix Rescue Mission \$1,000 to help purchase more water for those in need. As we wind down on this project I will get you the final tally.

Gift from Pastor Bill Good

The strikingly beautiful candleholder that rests on the Communion Table in the sanctuary at Fountain Hills Presbyterian Church was placed there in 2010 upon the arrival of Pastor Bill Good and remains there as his gift to FHPC.

The piece weighs about eleven pounds. It combines grace with strength and durability, so there are both masculine and feminine features as was intended and designed to be, according to the artist C. D. Weaver. The Rev. Dr. Clarence Deleon (C. D.) Weaver retired in 1999 from the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary and was subsequently named artist-in-residence at the seminary. His art and liturgical pieces can be seen in churches, seminaries, and private collections.

The piece is made of steel (with some hammer blows visible) indicative of the durable ancient church tradition and the strength of faith which has survived many blows and the fires of oppression; but it is the Rev. Dr. DeLeon's contemporary design which reflects our belief that this historic faith is also for modern persons.

Rev. Dr. Deleon states "the flames look like they are dancing around the light in celebration of something really, really joyful and full of delight."

Rev. Dr. Deleon was commissioned by Mountain View Presbyterian Church to create the artwork for Pastor Good as a retirement gift. He states: "It was a labor of love and things done with love always turn out better."

Pastor Bill would want us to remember his love for this church family as the candle burns during our worship services.




Certificates will be awarded to each person completing the seven courses. These courses are designed for every Christian but will be especially helpful to Church Leaders (Elders/Deacons).

Library Footnotes



Our church library has some good resources about the Sermon on the Mount for you to check out. One of them is a book titled *The Cost of Discipleship* by Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He was a German Protestant theologian who became involved in a plot to overthrow Adolf Hitler that led to his imprisonment and execution near the end of World War 2.

Another author Timothy Keller comments in one of his books that "Bonhoeffer warns about the dangers of what he called "cheap grace", the teaching that stresses only that grace is free, so it doesn't really matter how we live. The solution,

he said, was not to return to legalism, but to focus on how seriously God takes sin and on how he could only save us from it at infinite cost to himself. Understanding this must and will profoundly reshape our lives. We will not be able to live in a selfish, cowardly way. We will stand up for justice and sacrifice for our neighbor. And we won't mind the cost of following after Christ when we compare it to the price he paid to rescue us".

A Hunger for the Heights

In a sermon titled "Sky Hunger," Stan Purdum explores Ephesians 1:3, where Paul writes about God blessing us "in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places" (ESV). The expression "sky hunger," says the pastor, "suggests that to be the best earthbound people we can be, we need to lift our eyes to a higher place — the *highest* place."

While on a mission trip in Kentucky, Purdum discovered that many residents refer to pastors as sky pilots. "What better role can a pastor have," he asks, "than to point people to the skies, to the God Most High?"

The Easter anthem "Christ the Lord Is Risen Today," which celebrates our ultimate destination, sums up another definition of sky hunger:

Soar we now where Christ has led, alleluia! Following our exalted Head, alleluia! Made like him, like him we rise, alleluia! Ours the cross, the grave, *the skies*, alleluia!

"That to which our holy restlessness, our inner discontent, our sky hunger points us is Christ," Purdum concludes. "Sky hunger is a blessing from God, Paul tells us, to bring us into Christ, to fullness of life and to life eternal."



We hope we have not forgotten anyone! You all are such a blessing to us. Thank you from the bottom of our hearts.














Andrey Lull — In Concert June 25


SCOUTS Opening Night

Meet Our Musicians




Mike Pizzuto

My father was a professional musician, so I grew up with music in the house. I idolized my dad and have been playing ever since I could reach the piano keys. My dad taught me a lot of things and then sent me for formal lessons when I was about 9 years old. I began playing professionally when I was 15 with a Rock Group called the Rhythm Kings in Rockford, Illinois. I also played in a jazz quartet, and played guitar and sang in a folk trio. When I was 17, I went with the trio to California, and stayed there 2 years. While we had occasional gigs in some of the coffee houses in and around Los Angeles, it wasn't enough to sustain myself. I spent my days there working in a wood shop to put food on the table. When I was 19, I decided to return to Rockford and found a job playing 5 nights a week at a restaurant called the Saddle and Cycle. From that time on I was a full-time working musician.

I moved to Chicago in 1965, landing a job at the Ambassador East Hotel, the home of most visiting celebrities. After two years there, I moved to the Flame Restaurant in Countryside, Illinois until 1973 when I returned to Rockford. All that time I was going to the Chicago Conservatory College on Michigan Avenue in downtown Chicago while working full time in the evenings. I earned my bachelor's and master's degrees there. I've performed every kind of music you can imagine, playing with symphony orchestras, concert bands, jazz trios and other groups. In 1966 I moved to Arizona and, after freelancing for a year or so, landed a wonderful job performing in the Terrace Dining Room at the Phoenician resort. That lasted for 8 years, when the Phoenician decided to move away from live music for the most part. Since then, I've "semiretired," although I still spend a couple of hours every day on the piano, and still pick up some professional gigs now and then. As the old joke went, "Old musicians never die, they just go from "bar" to "bar."

I remember as a young boy thinking how much I loved to play, and wouldn't it be nice if I could make a living with my music. To have that dream come true is absolutely thrilling. I've taught privately and in institutions throughout my career and am blessed to have had so many students, some of whom are also enjoying careers in music. I am so blessed to have been able to pursue the profession that God has given me.

The best gift of all is my wife, Sue. She loves listening to me play and has filled up all the empty places in my heart and soul. Doug Katonak introduced us to each other some years ago. At that time, I lived in Scottsdale and Sue and I began dating. Eventually I sold my house and moved to Sue's lovely house. Shortly after that we were married by Pastor Bill Good. 
