
Thanksgiving is a time to give thanks to our Lord for His many blessings. We at Fountain Hills

- Volunteers, visible and welcoming ambassadors, play a crucial role in outreach efforts.
- Family-friendly activities like Explore-A-Truck and Storytime draw families to our campus.
- Mission projects and initiatives, such as CWS Blanket the World and EHFB Thanksgiving Food Drive, engage community supporters.

Raise Funds to Support Initiatives:



Library Footnotes

Hidden Christmas By Timothy Keller

As we approach the Advent Season, we again turn our attention to the Biblical Christmas Story.



Author Timothy Keller. an ordained pastor, points out that we uniquely have both a religious as well as a

secular Celebration at the same time. We hear cheery tunes as well as traditional Carols on a daily basis to fill our holiday thoughts and preparations. While many modern secular Christmas themes follow a "Fairy Tale" story line, which people know are not true, the Biblical story has always been accepted as true by Christians.

Keller explores the Gospel accounts of the birth of Jesus as well as Old Testament prophecies.

He notes the genealogy of Jesus recorded in Mathew to provide a historic connection.

He goes on to focus on the major characters in the story in separate short chapters to broaden the reality of knowing them as ordinary people caught up in extraordinary events. Mary, Joseph, and the Shepherds all had Angelic encounters and the records of their responses to the Angelic messages were one of human awe and humble obedience.

Throughout the book, Keller uses the metaphor of light and darkness. The darkness in the world can never be overcome by human efforts and only the divine light that came at Christmas can save the world.

In writing this book, Keller hopes to make the truth of Christmas less hidden in the maze of our modern secular celebrations.

Meet Our Musicians

All my life I have loved music! From my earliest memories as a child to today, I have been surrounded by music and musical people. My mother and father were musical. My dad played the harmonica, accordion, and Hawaiian guitar. My mother played the piano and organ. Of my

seven siblings, my oldest brother was very gifted musically, as he could hear a song once and then play it on the piano perfectly! He could play anything by ear, and eventually he learned to read music and served in his church as organist for several years.

As a little girl, my mother taught a "Good News Club" in our home with flannelgraph Bible stories and we sang lots of children's songs. In church, ever since I can remember, we sang songs in Children's Church. When I was in Jr. High and High School, I took organ lessons for five years. During my school years, one of my favorite things was when our church would have a "Hymn Sing" at someone's home after Sunday night service. We would go there and have snacks, and then sing hymns. As a result, I learn most hymns by heart – usually all four or five verses!

When I was a teenager, I joined a large, teen choir with 60 or so members from our church denomination from all over the State of Michigan, called "Teens for Christ;" and we traveled to other churches within our denomination to put on Christian concerts. When I turned sixteen, I joined our church adult choir and sang in it until I went away to college a couple of years later.

I like music from most musical genres, and enjoy a wide variety of musical entertainers. With the exception of my college years and early married life, I have always sung in a church choir. Big choirs, small choirs, medium-size choirs, and I have even been on a couple of Worship Teams leading congregational music. At Ken's first church, I helped by playing the organ during congregational singing. In later years, I helped to develop a Children's Choir at our church, and we put on a Christmas Musical Play for the congregation.

I sang my first solo at the age of 30, when I was asked to fill in at a Sunday night service for another soloist who had come down sick. I sang the song, "El Shaddai" by Amy Grant. Since then I have been invited to sing solos at church, at weddings, and funerals. I sang at both my father's and mother's funerals, and I also sang at the funeral of one of my brothers. I once sang "The Lord's Prayer," at a funeral service in our first church, for a baby who died at birth. It was the hardest thing I've ever had to do!!

During our years in Ohio, Ken was very involved not only in our church, but within our community serving for a couple of years as Executive Director of Development for the town we lived in. During this time, our town put on some fund raisers and community events. At one such event, I was in a "barbershop-type" quartet, and we sang songs to all the people passing by. It was a lot of fun.

Music is in great part how I express my love and worship to God. I love the hymns because they have such depth of meaning in the lyrics, and such lovely tones and harmonies in the musical scores. My favorite song of all-time is "The Hallelujah Chorus," from "The Messiah" composed in 1741 by George Frideric Handel. I love it so much, that it is even the ringtone on my cell phone! I imagine THIS IS THE SONG we will ALL be singing in Heaven on that glorious day when we are all reunited with Christ and our loved ones!

Hallelujah!!
