The general liturgical seasons of the Protestant church are Advent, Lent and Ordinary Time - the time not marked by a specific season. In this case the word "Ordinary" refers to the "ordinal numbers" (first, second, third, etc.) used to name and count the Sundays, i.e. the Third Sunday after Epiphany. It seems only recently that we celebrated Advent, the season of anticipation and celebration of Jesus' birth. Advent 2023 was a joyful and reassuring time as the church campus took on a festive look and Pastor Bob's sermons recalled people and events surrounding our Savior's birth with detail that we may not have previously considered. A favored poem of the Christmas story is beautifully expressed in Madeleine L'Engle's poem First Coming "... He did not wait for the perfect time. He came when the need was deep and great..."

The season of Lent began on Ash Wednesday, falling this year on Valentine's Day. We are blessed to again have the opportunity to strengthen our spirituality and discipleship as Pastor Bob continues Lenten Vespers on Wednesday evenings through March 20.

Holy Week begins on Palm Sunday with our traditional choir processional of waving palms and the draped cross on the chancel.

Maundy Thursday's Meager Meal in remembrance of the Last Supper and Jesus' betrayal will be celebrated in the Fellowship Center followed by worship in the sanctuary.

Good Friday is a solemn occasion when we will gather in the sanctuary at noon to reflect on the crucifixion and death of Jesus.

When Sunday morning, March 31, arrives we will celebrate the good news of Easter - Jesus' resurrection! The date changes from year to year in order to prevent Easter from being celebrated on the Jewish Passover. Easter is set on the Sunday after the first full moon after the spring equinox. Since the date of the vernal equinox changes from year to year, calculating the proper date can be difficult. The dates for both Passover and Easter fluctuate each year.

Ordinary Time in a non-liturgical sense is that period when we experience life's difficulty, illness, death – and also moments of grace and forgiveness. It's a time to focus on what it means to follow Jesus by spending time reading the Bible and developing a deeper prayer relationship with God. It's a time to put into practice the lessons we've learned in sermons and Bible studies.

All Seasons compel us to love God, love each other as we love ourselves and work together to do good works unto the community around us and to work together to make disciples for Him.



Growing in love for God and others, we make disciples for Jesus.

SESSION MEETING HIGHLIGHTS, January 16, 2024

Pastor Bob has advised that it is general practice by Presbyterian churches to make Session minutes available to be reviewed in the office of the church. Library Footnotes | Barbara Oakeson



Our church Library has some very good books about prayer which reinforce our Sunday morning sermon series launched in 2024. One good example is Prayer: *Finding the Heart's True Home* by the Quaker theologian and bestselling author Richard Foster. He provides an excellent and comprehensive survey of 21 forms of Christian prayer. He

groups the sections around three movements (inward, upward, and outward) which address three human needs (transformation, intimacy, and ministry). Foster presents the best thinking of various church traditions to help the reader feel drawn to prayer and to a restored and deeper relationship with oneself, God, and others.

Another point to mention that you will enjoy about this book is the diversity of source material that Foster

includes in his teaching. In addition, the great majority of this source material is well annotated in the index section of the book, which includes a bibliographical reference in the notes, a subject index, and a Scripture index as well. Another nice feature is the opening quotes from influential Christians spanning the history of our faith; words of encouragement, inspiration, and challenge. Additionally, each chapter ends in a prayer or benediction relative to the exercise and practice that was previously described.

Another "classic" book by this author also available in the church Library is Celebration of Discipline.



Lenten Signals

Why should we observe Lent? This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK and LISTEN.

We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest awhile — and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest self-examination, to look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and love, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection. And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN — to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit.

STOP, LOOK and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.

One of the church goals was to be active in developing the community, so in 1975 the church joined the Chamber of Commerce, and is still a member. Rev. Atchinson was elected President of the church in 1979.

Pastor Glenn's four siblings donated money in 1977 to purchase a piano, in memory of

there father. Today the piano is in the office of church music director Debbie Fisher. The piano was played by Mary Gillespie and sometimes by Ruth Collins. Ralph and Peggy Gunn donated an organ in 1979 that was used in the building on Enterprise Dr. It was moved to the new church building in 1983. Barbara Wyman and Margaret Wade took turns playing the organ. Soon a small choir formed. Mary was director, Barbara was organist, and Dorothy Parris sang in the choir and also accompanied on piano.

The church's present five-acre site was purchased in 1977 from the Town's developer for \$87,000. This was funded by a \$50,000 loan from the General Assembly, a \$24,000 loan the Southwest Synod, and \$13,000 from the congregation.

The church raised \$10,000 in 1979 for a new Allan organ, and Barbara Wyman was the first organist. Later, when Barbara became the choir director, Caryl Bates was the organist.

One of the church goals was to be active in developing the community, so in 1975 the In 1979 a Building Committee was elected, and that same year an annual outdoor worship service was begun, preceded by a cookout breakfast.

> The annual Congregational meeting was a very special occasion and was always well attended. It became an Annual Dinner, and there was enough space to hold it at the old Community Center (now the Community Theater building). Growth continued, so the Annual Congregational Dinner was celebrated in November 1981 in the Catholic Church of the Ascension, with the meal prepared and served by the women from Shepard of the Hills Lutheran Church.

Groundbreaking for the Fountain Hills Presbyterian Church building was on Sunday, March 20,1983 and the sanctuary held its first service on Sunday, December 18. The congregation hosted a community open house on March 18, 1984. Its Dedication Service was March 25, 1984.

In 1986 the congregation approved plans for a Program Center building to house a nursery and classrooms, and called for an Associate Pastor. Steven Frazier served as Associate Pastor. Steven Frazier served as Associate Pastor from 1988 to 1992. Also during this time the church records were computerized.

The program center and the columbarium were dedicated in 1989, the same year the Carillon was installed.

Connecticut College; Clarinetist Chris "Doc" Stewart, a retired Mayo Clinic ER doctor who also plays saxophone and flute in a variety of musical genres; Bassoonist Marty Haub, a retired math teacher and former conductor of the Chandler Symphony and the Scottsdale Philharmonic; and French horn player Stacey D'Abate who is also a member of the Arizona Winds Band in the West Valley, the Alleluia Orchestra at Scottsdale Bible Church and the Poliziano Orchestra in Tuscany.

Presby Pickins' hit a home run in February, marking our most successful event yet. The vibe was electrifying, with a steady flow of shoppers and numerous inquiries about becoming vendors, with two folks signing up on the spot. And get this – we're adding a new food vendor for March, the Lumpia Queen of AZ, bringing delicious Filipino cuisine to our lineup!

Financially, we smashed records. Sales of donated items hit an all-time high of \$1,050, and rentals brought in \$985, pushing our total gross income for the day over \$2,000. Our cumulative earnings since the beginning stands at an impressive \$23,276, with a current balance of \$7,694 after donations and expenses.

Chef Arlene also knocked it out of the park with her yummy breakfast sandwiches, hand pies and brownies. Her goodies are not priced, instead she accepts donations which are quite generous. Learning of her goal to fund a new commercial refrigerator for our kitchen, an extremely kind gentleman contributed a crisp \$100 bill plus two 20's! What a blessing! Our commitment to giving back remained strong. We invested \$300 in a new ice machine, donated \$250 to the FH Ministerial Association's Good Samaritan Fund, and chipped in \$400 for new table linens for the Deacons. Plus, we hosted the Fountain Hills Drug Coalition high school volunteers who made a splash, adding 15 new names to their mailing list and receiving \$80 in donations, on top of the \$200 PP award. To date, Presby Pickins' has distributed just over \$8,000 to church and community causes.

Our volunteers are the heart and soul of Presby Pickins.' From pricing to setup to cleanup, their dedication and camaraderie make each market day a success. And let's not forget our church family members who generously donate items for sale – their contributions make a real difference.

We kicked it up a notch with DJ Steve spinning tunes to energize the crowd. Pairadocs++, Jim Landau and friends, returned in February playing a mix of country, folk, popular tunes, mostly from the 60's and 70's.

Presby Pickins' isn't just a market; it's a community hub where we come together to have a blast and make a difference.

Mission Committee Packs Food at Midwest Food Bank Arizona



Three members of the Mission Committee plus spouses packed food for the needy at Midwest Food Bank Arizona, a faith based organization that shares the love of Christ by alleviating hunger locally

and throughout the world. Jack and Monique Reynolds, Susan Owens, and George and Mary Holtan participated in the food packing. Spending 2 hours packing nutritious food with many other volunteers from around the area, some from Fountain Hills, was a heartwarming experience. Together we packed over 41,000 bags of food to distribute. Midwest Food Bank Arizona provides food to over 280 food pantries, soup kitchens, shelters, and other nonprofit organizations to those in need in our communities. It also provides relief to victims of natural disasters. MFB packs rice and beans with minerals and vitamins, through a program called Tender Mercies, which ships locally and around Food for Kidz the world. Hope Packs, another MFB program provides children with supplemental weekend food. There are now 12 Arizona Food Bank locations. Ten are in the United States and there is one distribution center in North Africa and one distribution in Haiti run by Overture International which is the organization Jack Reynolds founded. FHPC members can help support the mission of Midwest Food Bank Arizona through prayer, volunteering at a food packing event, and/or donating. Over 99 cents of every dollar donated goes to MFB programs and services. There are 800 volunteers for every paid staff member. You can also use your tax credit to feed our hungry neighbors through one of the four programs. Share the love of Christ through this mission work.
