


Clerk's Corner | Jack Reynolds




Are You Connected?







The Virtues of Aging by Jimmy Carter



In less than 150 pages, Carter blends practical advice on how to have a satisfying life in our aging years with a memoir of his personal and political life.

At the age of 56, Carter was involuntarily retired (his words) and returned home to face possible bankruptcy. His finances improved when he was able to

find a buyer for the Carter Peanut Warehouse and publish his presidential memoir. He went on to establish The Carter Center to pursue and expand his interests in human rights. In 2002, he received a Nobel Peace Prize for related work.

Carter describes "virtue" as "a particular beneficial advantage" and "an inherent quality that is admirable." A beneficial advantage for senior citizens can sometimes include something as simple as a discounted cost of a cup of coffee. A more significant advantage would be the good fortune of a strong and supportive family. An inherent quality that is admirable may be wisdom—"the ability to exercise good judgment about important but uncertain matters in life."

A poll of Americans revealed a consensus that a person is considered to be old at 73. Making an effort to maintain good health a priority can extend that well beyond 80. Several recreational activities, both physically and mentally challenging, are suggested as ways to maintain a healthy body.

Accumulating a financial base is an important aspect of planning for retirement. Carter also suggests identifying one's interests and abilities and implementing them as crucial for an interesting and productive senior citizen lifestyle.

The statistics shared regarding life expectancy, medical care, and Social Security predate our current situation, but the trend shows no improvement in the numbers.

Carter suggests practical advice in planning for the final distribution of personal belongings and leaving a will, reminding us that no matter what we do, the IRS will be one of our major heirs!

Admittedly keeping Biblical references to a minimum, Carter cites Paul's words in 1 Corinthians 13, the central theme of love. He ends with the following statement: "the simple things ... and the exploration of love in all its forms—are the key to the virtues of life, at any age."

A Brief Biography of James Earl "Jimmy" Carter, Jr.

Born: October 1, 1924 (age 100), Plains, GA

In 1943, Carter received an appointment to the Naval Academy. On July 7, 1946, he married Rosalynn Smith of Plains. After seven years of service as a naval officer, Carter returned to Plains to take over the family business. In 1962, he was elected a state senator, and eight years later, he was elected governor of Georgia.

Carter served as the 39th President of the US for one term, from 1977 to 1981, winning the election against Republican Gerald Ford. He pardoned all Vietnam War draft evaders on his second day in office. He was defeated by Ronald Reagan in November 1980.

The Carters have three sons, one daughter, nine grandsons (one deceased), three grandaughters, five great-grandsons, and nine great-grandaughters.

On February 18, 2023, President Carter decided to spend his remaining time at home with his family and receive hospice care.

The Worship & Music Committee has a long tradition of placing a wreath, beautifully decorated for each season,



above the choir loft.
After considering the talent and expense necessary to keep the wreaths fresh and attractive—along with the need for someone to climb a very tall ladder to install and remove them—it was suggested

by committee member Mary Holtan that we consider replacing the wreath with a permanent piece of art.

It was an exciting idea, but not without obstacles. Where do we find the appropriate piece of art? Could it possibly be a one-of-a-kind creation specifically for our church? How will it be paid for?

Jack Morris introduced us to an artist who provided a gracious bid and understood our desire for a piece that would draw each individual who sees it into a closer relationship with the Holy Spirit. That is our hope: that as you look at the sculpture, it touches you in a way that gives you confidence in and moves you closer to God.

The timing was perfect for a special addition to the sanctuary as we anticipated the 50th anniversary of our church. What better time to reflect on all those who had been part of building this church but are no longer with us? The artwork was paid for with memorial funds.

In considering scripture for the interpretation of the art, the Committee selected Romans 8:10-14 (NIV), which states:

"But if Christ is in you, then even though your body is subject to death because of sin, the Spirit gives life because of righteousness. And if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, he who raised Christ from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies because of his Spirit who lives in you. Therefore, brothers and sisters, we have an obligation—but it is not to the flesh, to live according to it. For if you live according to the flesh, you will die, but if by the Spirit you put to death the misdeeds of the body, you will live. For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God."

The sculpture, dedicated on October 20, 2024, was created by artist Tracy Paul. Tracy lives in Scottsdale, and Christian artwork is intuitive for her. Her artwork is also on display at Living Waters Lutheran Church, where her husband is the pastor.

Many of us are familiar with the concept of "Covenant Partners" at FHPC—individuals who have chosen FHPC as their "home church" and have formalized their commitment, granting them full membership rights, including the ability to speak and vote in formal church meetings.

The Power of Prayer




If you are ill or recovering, hospitalized or anticipating a procedure, or going through some difficult times, please let us know so that our church family can raise you in prayer.
