


Lenten Vespers Services






The Prodigal God by Timothy Keller

Surely the title of this book is wrong. Should it not be the Prodigal Son? Or perhaps The Two Lost Sons as it is as much about the elder brother as the younger? And why prodigal? The word does not mean wayward but rather "to spend until you have

nothing left" which both father and younger son do. The father's effusive welcome of his errant son shows us God's reckless grace is "our greatest hope and the subject of this book".

There were two groups of people listening to Jesus the day he presented this parable: tax collectors and sinners, and Pharisees and lawyers. The first had left traditional morality, and the second studied and obeyed the scriptures. Jesus was speaking directly to them as they were spiritually lost-the religious and the irreligious. They represent the two sons who in this parable are alienated from the father: the younger son disrespects him by wanting out of the family and the elder son is furious because his brother has taken much of his inheritance. He has stayed in place, doing the "right" things and resents not getting his due. The younger brother's undisciplined and self-indulgent life collapses while his brother's calculated control of his environment falls apart. Both are on self salvation projects. What do they need to escape this loss? The father expresses love to both, cares for both.

Jesus challenges both groups and their ideas of sin and salvation. He is the radical alternative. He pleads in love with His enemies, for the prerequisite for receiving the grace of God is to know you need it. The choice is theirs to make. He retells the story of the human race in this parable. We see the sweeping theme of biblical exile and homecoming. We suffer spiritual homesickness because we long to be reunited with something in the universe from which we feel cut off. We were meant to live in His presence not in brokenness and conflict. He came to



bring the feast of homecoming. How?

Jesus Christ is the true elder brother who seeks out the younger and pays the infinite cost of His life to bring us all into God's family. Forgiveness always involves a price. Our true elder brother paid our debt on the cross in our place. He experienced the exile we deserved, took on the full curse of human rebellion. Selfless love, reckless grace. It destroys the mistrust in our hearts toward God that makes us either younger brothers or elder brothers. Home again.

This might be a short book but it is rich in depth, context, and instruction. Highly recommended.



2025 ECO Gathering

After a prayerful study in 2016, FHPC joined ECO: A covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians. As a Presbyterian denomination, ECO adheres to a Reformed theology and Presbyterian Polity. Its mission is to build flourishing churches that make disciples of Jesus Christ.

In January, ECO had its national gathering in Dallas, Texas. I had the privilege to attend representing our church, along with Pastor Bob and Jeanette

Simmons. Over 1,300 people attended from all over the US to enjoy Christian fellowship and exchange ideas to help their churches flourish in the 21st century. The theme for the gathering as expressed in John 15:4-5, English Standard Version, focused on *ABIDE*: "Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for apart from me you can do nothing."

As expected, gatherings of 1,300 Presbyterians were not only informative but inspiring. I was most impressed by the worship service and the energy of the group. Besides the general sessions, there were display booths and an opportunity to engage with various vendors of related services.

As a delegate, you could select from about three dozen breakout sessions. I was particularly interested in the one on Pastoral Search and Transition, which included a great presentation and exchange with others in the search phase. During this meeting, Pastor Bob was elected as vice moderator for the next year. When I went to the ECO website and clicked on the Hope Presbytery, I saw a familiar picture.
