


#### Clerk's Corner | Jack Reynolds



#### "THE VALUES THAT SHAPE US"




#### Women's Bible Study Jeanette Simmons & Janet Scaggs

St. Francis of Assisi was an Italian friar who lived in Italy in the 13th century. He lived a life of ascetic poverty and was dedicated to Christian charity. His prayer for peace is well known for its inspiring message:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.

Where there is hatred let me sow love,

Where there is injury let me sow pardon,

Where there is doubt, faith,

Where there is despair, hope,

Where there is darkness, light,

And where there is sadness, joy.

O Divine Master

Grant that I may not seek so much to be consoled as to console,


To be understood as to understand.

To be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive, It is in forgiving that we are forgiven, And it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

Make Me an Instrument of Your Peace: Living in the Spirit of the Prayer of St. Francis. Expanding upon each line of the prayer, he shares touching, inspiring stories from his own experience and that of others and reveals how each of us can make a difference for good in ordinary ways without being heroes or saints. Struggling to help a young son comfort his best friend when his mother dies; moved by the courage of war, enemies who reconcile; being wrenched out of self-absorbed depression by responding to someone else's tragedy; taking a spirited old lady on a farewell taxi ride through her town - these are the kinds of everyday moments in which Nerburn finds we can live out the spirit of Saint

Author Kent Nerburn has written a lovely little book Francis. It is a true spiritual gem!

Mission Committee Sponsored Activities in May:

The Code Red Summer Heat Relief Campaign by the Phoenix Rescue Mission is a program designed to help prevent heat-related illnesses and deaths among homeless individuals in Phoenix during the summer months. The mission provides life-saving resources like water, shelter, and hygiene kits to those experiencing homelessness. Phoenix summers can be extremely hot, and homeless individuals are at a higher risk of heat-related illnesses and death. By providing essential resources and connecting individuals with support, the Code Red campaign helps prevent tragedies and improve the lives of vulnerable people.

The **Code Red** water drive has started at FHPC and will continue until August. This is an extremely

important mission with the heat in Arizona. FHPC will once again serve as the town-wide



donation center for the Code Red Summer Heat Relief. The Mission Committee will collect 24-pack bottled water or you can contribute money to buy water. If you give a check, write "Code Red" on the memo. Drop your check or cash in the offering box or bring it to the church office. Give generously!


