



#### "THE VALUES THAT SHAPE US"




# Women's Bible Study Jeanette Simmons & Janet Scaggs



# May Book Review What Did You Do in the War, Sister? by Denis Turner

In 2016, the author met a member of the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur who mentioned she'd recently discovered a cache of letters that hadn't been seen for 70 years. These letters and documents had been written by Sisters of Notre Dame during the Nazi occupation of Belgium and told the story of how brave and faithful these women were, working to defeat the Nazis. These documents were used by the author as the foundation for the book What Did You Do in the War, Sister?

The book is a fictional memoir based on actual historical events. It gives us a new perspective on World War Two and the role Catholic Sisters played in the Belgian Resistance movement. During the war, these faithful Catholic Sisters helped the resistance by running contraband, hiding Jews, spying for the Allies, and performing small acts of sabotage. As you read the story, you will discover that the nuns outsmarted the Nazis—and there will also be times when the story brings a smile to your face.

The author had never written a book, and he also didn't believe in the existence of God. He was concerned about writing a story about an order of sisters whose belief is in God.



Interestingly, the author had attended a Catholic grade school, high school, and college, where he earned a minor degree in Theology. Writing this book made the author realize he had received a good education and helped him see the positive side of organized religion and appreciate the contributions the nuns made to the war effort.

When you read this book, please also read the Author's Reflections at the end. Happy Reading.
