

From the Pastor's Pen | Pastor Jim Rizer



"THE HEART OF THE MATTER"

A few years ago, I knew a woman who suffered from bouts of extremely low blood pressure. At one point she described that it was like her heart would lose interest. Concerned about the potential impact of this she shared that she was hoping that her doctor would find some other problem. What if another organ or gland was the root of the problem? What if she changed her diet? She wanted it to be anything but the heart.

I wonder if we are not similar. As we confront the reality of our brokenness, we too long for it to be something other than our hearts. What if we adopted a new devotional regimen? What if we changed our "spiritual" diet? What if we redefine sin? What if we regulate our behavior with stricter principals or better laws?

Jesus addresses this wresting as he unpacks what truly defiles a person.

²⁰ And he said, "What comes out of a person is what defiles him. ²¹ For from within, out of the heart of man, come evil thoughts, sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, ²² coveting, wickedness, deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride, foolishness. ²³ All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person."

The source of the uncleanliness and brokenness is the heart. As much as we long for it to be something else the problem is the heart. This reality reminds us that the societal ills that we are facing; a contentious culture, festering anger, and racial injustice; need to be addressed at both the corporate level as well as the individual. In the larger arena we need wise change, but there is also a limit to what we can regulate with laws and mandates. The other change that is needed is individual heart change. This happens one heart at a time through the renewing and healing love of Christ.

Jesus wisely revealed the role of the heart in Matthew 5. Long before an act of murder there is sustained heart

held hatred that was left untended. Long before the act of adultery there was a lustful heart. Without addressing the battlefield of the heart, we truncate the potential for true change. It is impossible for the unredeemed heart to achieve the loving, just society we desire. We must participate individually into the change that we anticipate.


God, grant us the wisdom to see the reality in our hearts and match our passion for change outside of us with a fervent desire for you to change the inside of us. Amen.

Bible Study: The Sermon on the Mount




"Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them." Matthew 5:1-2

These opening words from the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7) remind us of the treasure that we have been entrusted with. After the calling of the first disciples, Jesus sits down and teaches them and the crowds about the inverted nature of the kingdom of God, the need to


address the heart behind the action, how to pray, and the heart of the Father. These three

chapters are so rich that Dale Bruner writes, "To read the Sermon on the Mount is to discover what it means to be a disciple of Jesus; to read it with faith is to receive the power to be a disciple." (Christbook, p. 132)"

Beginning **September 3** the Wednesday morning and evening Bible study will begin to walk through these chapters together. Bring your Bible, your curiosity, and a desire to discover more of the richness of the Sermon on the Mount.


Women's Bible Study Janet Scaggs

The month of September begins my tradition of getting everything prepared for our annual Christmas card program featuring handwritten notes to our Church-connected military. In order to get to the appropriate time to mail out the cards, a lot of work needs to be done, like stuffing envelopes with the notepads for members and friends to write the notes. Next step is to place the list of names of the recipients in each envelope. The next step is to prepare all the envelopes to be passed out to those willing to write handwritten notes. The next step is to gather all the envelopes with notes to be placed in individual Christmas cards that had been gathered, hopefully addressed correctly, and ready to be mailed on two different dates, to those who are deployed and then to those who are stationed stateside. The envelopes with the notepads will be passed around beginning the first or second Sunday of October and the second Sunday in November is usually the deadline to return your notes back to me or leave in the office.



During all of this Christmas card preparation time, donations still need to be collected to help our homeless military and veterans. Please remember as you do so, kindly think of donations of toiletries, our most needed items. With the fall season soon upon us, we return to the collection of warmer wear clothing, like long sleeved tshirts and jackets, hats and caps, socks and shoes, bedding and other such items.

Please remember that our Veterans and Troops Ministry is year-round and it never stops. We are always happy to see Church members and friends from our community placing items in our collection box, located in the Narthex on the East side, in the basket out front as you enter the Church and in the Church office. 
