

From the Pastor's Pen | Pastor Jim Rizer



"SO THAT YOU MAY"

As we begin October, we are greeted with the return of pumpkin spice everything and decorations to remind us that Autumn has come, even if our leaves don't change color locally. October is also the time that we consider Biblical stewardship. Although more than four letters, for a portion of the church our guard goes up and the volume goes down when we hear the word "stewardship." Yet, I wonder if that is not because we have missed the heart of the matter.

One of the great texts on stewardship is 2 Corinthians 9:7-8: 7 Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work.

Verse 7 reminds us of the heart with which we are to give. Notice that we decide in our hearts, not our heads, and that the motivation isn't duty or extraction. It is intended to be done in joy and with cheer, giving back part of our time, talent, and treasure to the One who so richly has blessed us. Our heart matters.


Verse 8 gives us a glimpse of God's heart for us. In essence what it says is God is choosing to bless you more than amply so that you can not only participate but abound in every good work. The verse stresses the completeness of Godly provision: in all things, at all times, for every good work. If we read on to verse II, we hear that God is giving to us so that we may experience a generosity that reflects His generosity. God's heart is that we might get to participate, abound, and be generous.

When I was young my grandfather invited us grandkids to join in a game of Tripoley. He got out the game mat and explained the game including the need to have a decent number of pennies to play. Knowing we had none, he produced cups of coins so we could participate and enjoy the game together. I wonder if this is not like our Heavenly Father's heart, generously giving so that His children can joyfully and willingly participate in every good work and be generous in every way.

Biblical scholar Dale Bruner puts it this way: "To read the Sermon on the Mount is to

discover what it means to be a disciple of Jesus; to read it with faith is to receive the power to be a disciple."

We invite you to join us on Wednesdays—morning or evening—as we continue exploring this rich passage together. Bring your Bible, an open heart, and a desire to grow in Christ.





How time goes by fast when one has so much happening all at the same time and that is where I seem to find myself these days. I am thankful for the help I have received when needed and all the good thoughts and prayers. Believe it or not, I am right on time where I need to

be with the upcoming Christmas projects for our Troops and for our local homeless veterans. If you are reading this monthly report, then that means that it is October when I begin to pass out the envelopes that have the names of our Church-connected military and the note pad in it for all who are willing, to take an envelope to write a note to be placed inside the individual Christmas cards which will be mailed to those deployed by mid-November and stateside will be mailed mid-December.

Also planned for this month, as soon as I can get scheduled, is a pickup of all the donations that have come in this past month. I have been in contact with CBI (Community Bridges, Inc.) and iust need to select a mutual date and time for them to come to my garage. I am also respectfully asking for much needed donations of toiletries which are desperately in need. Items needed are tooth brushes, tooth paste, bars of soap, hand-sanitizers, shampoo, combs and brushes, deodorants, packages of wet-wipes, and lotions. The next part of my mission project will be the purchase of winter wear like sweat pants and shirts and long-sleeved t-shirts, socks, etc. Once these items have been purchased, they will be taken to Packages from Home, which is located in Glendale, and they will do the packaging and shipping.

The next part of this project is the Christmas cards. I will ask again from all of our Church-

connected military families to confirm current ranks and addresses so I can begin the process of making the mailing labels to be placed on each Christmas card. I love stuffing the cards with the notes and believe me when I say that these notes are so meaningful to each one who has received a card. Joy and smiles are very important and meaningful.

During all of this Christmas card preparation time, donations still need to be collected to help our local homeless military and veterans. Please remember donations of toiletries are our most



needed items along with cold weather clothing, like long sleeved t-shirts, pants, jackets, hats, socks, shoes, bedding, and calendars, too.

Please remember that our Veterans and Troops Ministry is year-round; it never stops. We are always happy to see Church members and friends from our community placing items in our collection box, located in the Narthex on the East side, in the basket cart out front as you enter the Church and in the Church office. Thanks again to all of you who bring in donations to help make our military ministry a complete success.

The Chosen, a Review | Monique Reynolds



The Chosen is a historical drama about Jesus of Nazareth as seen through the eyes of the people who interacted with Him. It was created, directed and co-written by Dallas Jenkins as a streaming series planned for seven seasons—five have been released. Watched by millions worldwide, it is award winning. All of the past seasons were supported by crowdfunding. In fact many of the extras in the crowd scenes are unpaid supporters of the project. They wanted to participate in this

wonderful production. It stars Jonathan Roumie as Jesus who in Season I begins His ministry by inviting fishermen to study with Him. It is through them and others that we rediscover Jesus's humanity/divinity and His impact on their lives. Filmed in Utah and Texas the biblical setting is dry, dusty and desolate, but this series is not. It is a rich retelling of Christ's short time here, the people He knew and His teachings.

A few of my favorite scenes were: the joyous wedding at Cana; the Samaritan woman at the well; the Sermon on the Mount; the feeding of the 5000; the healing of the crippled man at the pool of Bethesda; Jesus's triumphant entry into Jerusalem. There were so many more.


At first the twelve are confused. There are questions, doubts, misunderstandings aplenty but also a willingness to follow, listen and learn. After three years they remain with Him. He is their exemplar. These chosen disciples share their lives with us—their fears, their joys, their love for Him, their sorrows. They are like us. We are chosen too. As we sometimes struggle to understand, we come together for worship and celebration as they did. We are a family as they became one.

To make their accounts more compelling the writers give us backstories for the characters, fleshing out what we already know, filling in the blanks, connecting the dots. Food for thought, fodder for self reflection. Noted in the opening credits of the first episode is the following disclaimer:

"The Chosen is based on the true stories of the gospels of lesus Christ. Some locations and timelines have been combined

or condensed. Backstories and some characters or dialogue have been added. However, all biblical and historical context and any artistic imagination are designed to support the truth and intention of the Scriptures. Viewers are encouraged to read the gospels."

You will learn more about the Romans, the Zealots, the Sanhedrin, or about what the disciples ate, what they wore and that they walked and camped out a lot. But nothing is without



controversy these days. Some may think that this added information though done in historical context is artistic liberty gone too far. That is a decision for viewers to make. I see it as a challenge, an encouragement to read or reread the Bible, to think, to discuss. Jesus speaks to us in many ways. This viewer waits in anticipation of the next two seasons.

The Chosen, Seasons I-5 on DVD is available in our own library. Recommended. It is also available to be streamed on Prime.


