Deacons play a vital yet often quiet role in the life of our church, focusing on the physical and spiritual care of our congregation. Their responsibilities include serving church members and friends by meeting practical needs and offering compassionate support.

Deacons lead ministries of compassion and community outreach, and they help manage essential church matters such as:

- Delivering home meals
- Providing transportation
- Sending birthday cards or making calls
- Offering support for health concerns and friendly visits
- Bringing home communion
- Assisting with Celebration of Life services

Why Does This Matter?

Deacons embody Christ's call to serve others. Their work ensures that no one in our church family feels forgotten or alone. Whether it's a warm meal, a caring phone call, or a quiet prayer, these acts of kindness strengthen the bonds of fellowship and reflect God's love in action.

How Can You Be Involved?

FHPC members are invited to serve as ordained deacons for a three-year term. Deacons meet monthly, and all church members are welcome to attend these meetings. We also have a dedicated group of volunteers known as our **Care Team**, who assist when additional help is needed. If you're not ready for a full term, consider joining the Care Team for occasional service opportunities.

“ONE GAVE THANKS”

¹² And as he entered a village, he was met by ten lepers, who stood at a distance ¹³ and lifted up their voices, saying, “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us.” ¹⁴ When he saw them he said to them, “Go and show yourselves to the priests.” And as they went they were cleansed. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice; ¹⁶ and he fell on his face at Jesus' feet, giving him thanks. Now he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus answered, “Were not ten cleansed? Where are the nine?”

Luke 17

In Luke 17 we find 10 people with leprosy calling out to Jesus for mercy. At that time to be diagnosed with leprosy meant that you had to live on the outskirts of town separated from your family and friends, you were unable to work or worship, and you had to declare to all who passed by that you had leprosy. Considering the impact of their ailment we can appreciate their desire to cry out for mercy, healing, and restoration.

Jesus instructs them to go the priest, who could confirm the diagnosis or cleansing, and along the way they were cleansed. Imagine one moment you couldn't enter your house or be in town and the next you got your life back. How would you respond?

Their responses are telling. Nine went on their way plugging back in and reconnecting. One returned to Jesus and gave thanks. Their responses highlight how quickly we are to call out for divine assistance and how rapidly we are to move on when our prayers are answered. We are more prone to move from request to request than to pause for thanks or remain in an attitude of gratitude.

I wonder if it would be different if we kept an answered prayer list that would allow us to be reminded of how we have been sustained, healed, renewed, and delivered.

Psalm 9:1 encourages us to “give thanks to the Lord with (our) whole heart; and recount all of your wonderful deeds.” What would it look like if we focused on recounting all God's wonderful deeds, rather than the next aspect of imperfection and brokenness, or the distracting busyness of our days?

Ten called out for mercy and were delivered. Nine went away while one gave thanks. Which one will you be?

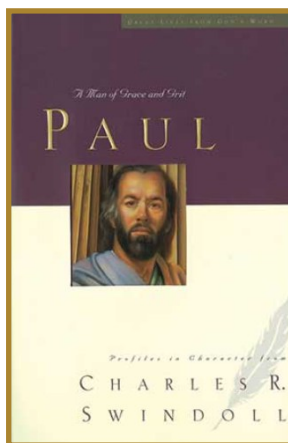

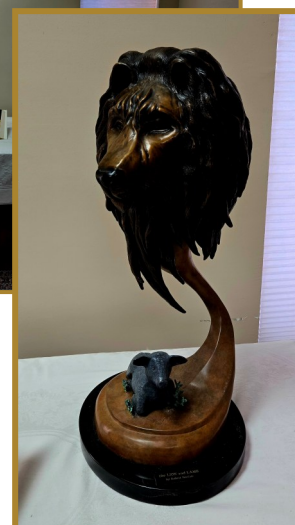
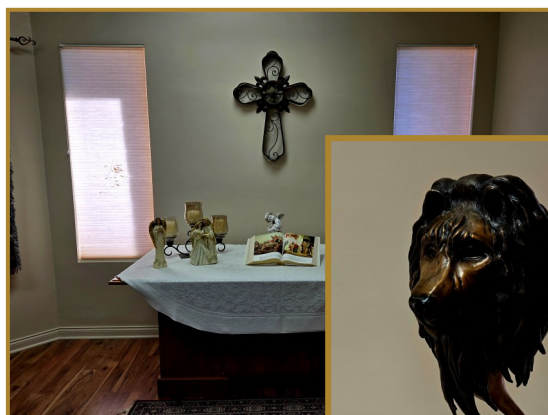

The 36-Hour Day: A Family Guide to Caring for People with Alzheimer Disease, other Dementias, and Memory Loss in Later Life by Nancy Mace and Peter Rabins

For 40 years, *The 36-Hour Day* has been the leading work in the field for caregivers of those with dementia. Written by

experts with decades of experience caring for individuals with memory loss, Alzheimer's, and other dementias, the book is widely known for its authoritativeness and compassionate approach to care. Featuring everything from the causes of dementia to managing its early stages to advice on caring for those in the later stages of the disease, it is widely considered to be the most detailed and trusted book available.

Nancy L. Mace, M.A., is currently teaching dementia care internationally. She has been a consultant to the Office of Technology Assessment, U.S. Congress, and to the Alzheimer's Association, and she was an assistant in psychiatry and coordinator of the T. Rowe and Eleanor Price Teaching Service at the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences of the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

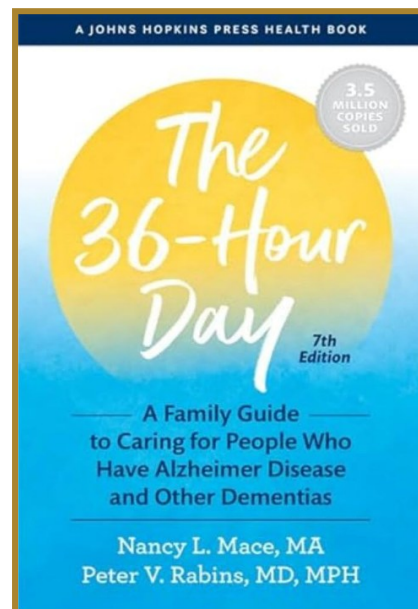

Teaching Service of the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

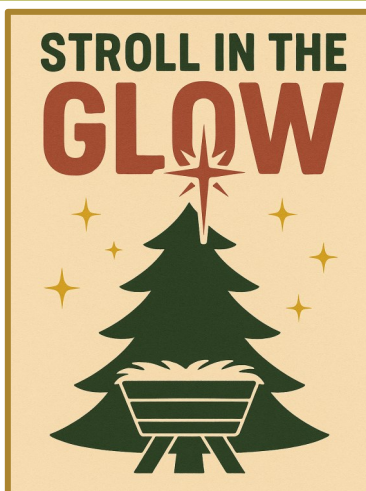
This book is a very helpful resource to caregivers and/or family members navigating the challenges of caring for a loved one who has been

Community House Outreach On **Monday, September 29**, under the leadership of **Kim Caputo**, our team prepared and served a hearty meal to approximately **100 guests** at

Community House in Scottsdale. The menu featured enchilada casserole, seasoned rice, corn, sour cream, chips and salsa, jalapeños, apples, and dessert cakes. Guests expressed their gratitude with comments like, *“The best meal in a long time—Mexican food, my favorite!”*

Service began at 5 PM and concluded by 6 PM, with cleanup completed swiftly. Of the **\$500 budget**, **\$380.59** was spent on ingredients, and the remaining funds were donated directly to Community House.

We are deeply grateful for the opportunity to serve our unhoused neighbors and share God's love through food and fellowship. The service team included Kim Caputo and her five family members, Christine Colley, and Debbie Olson. The next meal service is scheduled for **December 29**, led by **Debbie Olson**. All are welcome to join in this meaningful ministry.

Mission Committee Giving Highlights

- **Community House Meals** \$500 allocated per meal; unused funds donated to Community House.
- **Reverend Howard's Ministry in Africa** \$500 donated to support his ongoing mission work.
- **SAWs (Servants at Work)** \$1,000 donated to build ramps for individuals with disabilities in our local community.

- **Haiti – Overture International** \$3,000 donated to support humanitarian efforts led by **Jack Reynolds**.

- **Veterans Support – Donna Sims** Donna continues collecting warm clothing and toiletries for veterans. She has also launched the **Christmas Card Project** for our military church family members. Please return cards to Donna by the **second Sunday in November**.

- **Holiday Meals** \$1,000 each donated to **Phoenix Rescue Mission (men)** and **Changing Lives Center (women)** for holiday meals.

- **Christmas Gifts for Community House Families** \$1,000 allocated to provide gifts for families in need.

- **Alaska Flooding Disaster Relief** \$500 donated to aid victims of **Typhoon Halong**, which displaced over 1,000 villagers. This request was brought forward by **Jane Allen**, who considers these communities her northern neighbors.

- **The Globe Flood Relief Fund** \$1,000 donated to aid reconstruction of the town.

Columbarium



The Columbarium provides a final resting place for the mortal remains of members and friends. Along with the urn niches, there is a Wall of Remembrance, a waterfall and memorial benches, providing a lovely place for prayer and meditation. It is managed by the Columbarium Trustees, a committee of our church corporation. A trust fund insures proper maintenance and perpetual care of the area.

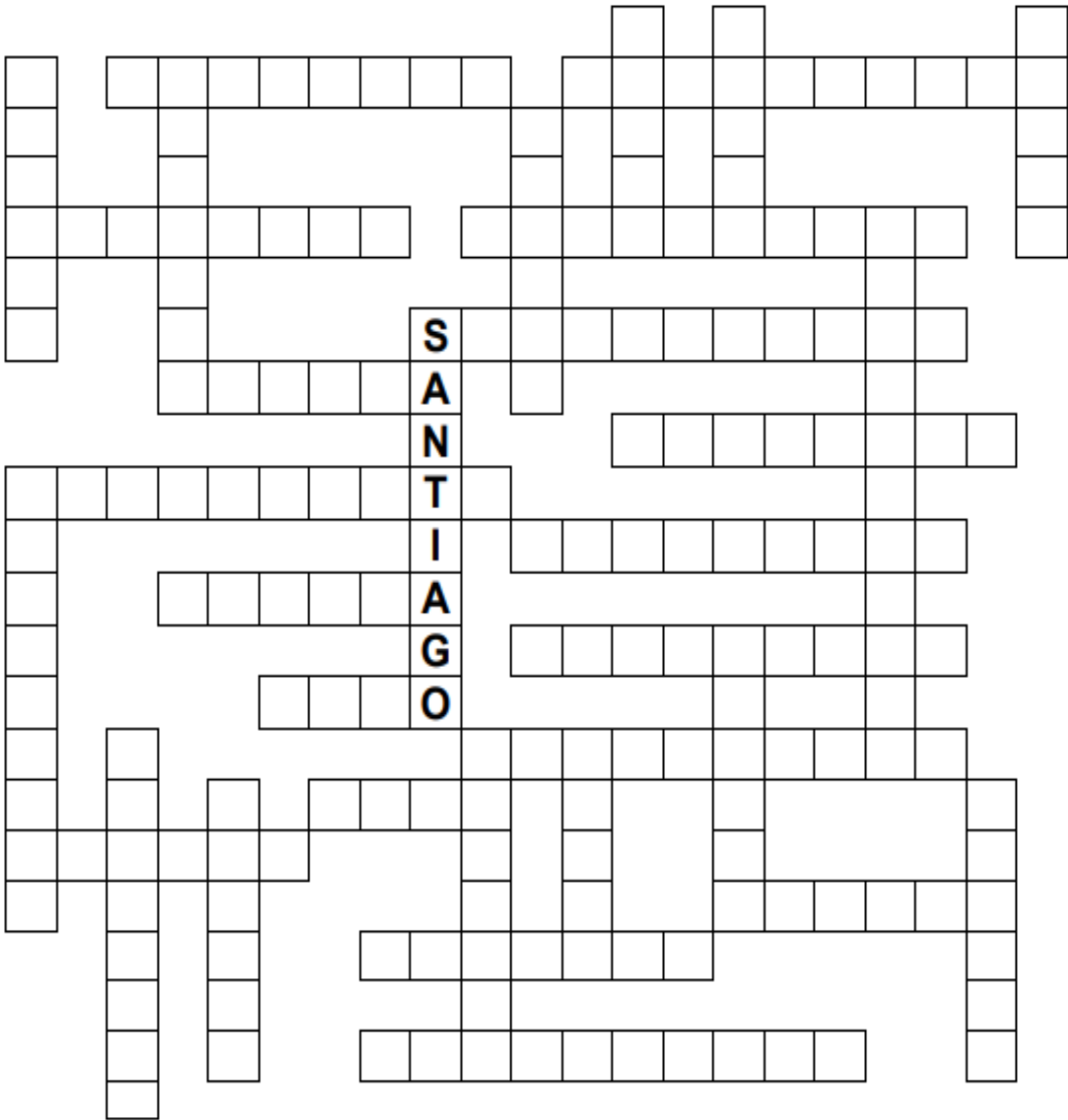
